

Proof of the Pudding

Change is a difficult notion for most of us. Like the Pharisees and Sadducees we probably think we are okay just the way we are. In our youth we might have had a go at some 'character building' but as we age we tend to hope that others will accept us warts and all. Then along comes John the Baptist with his Advent message "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near." It seems that staying just the way we are is not an option.

'Repentance' is an unfashionable word, but it simply means a 'change of direction'. It also implies that we should be sorry for our old way of

life. But as John points out, saying 'sorry' isn't enough. We must be able to provide the proof of the pudding. Lip service is all too easy. Saying that we are sorry and that we want to change is a good start, but unless we put any practical provision into place, our good intentions are going to remain exactly that.... good intentions.

John gives us a piece of very helpful advice for making our good intentions fruitful. In preparing a way for Christ in our lives we must "Make straight his paths." That means identifying the obstacles that have prevented us from getting things right in the past and removing them. If for instance our change of heart means giving more money to the poor we will first have to identify what has stopped us doing that in the past. If our change of heart involves spending more time with an elderly relative we must first delegate some of the work that keeps us from doing that in the here and now. If a character trait such as shyness, laziness or prejudice get in the way of things we would like to do, then perhaps now is a good time to devise some strategies that will help make change possible. If we are serious about wanting to change, John has more advice to offer. "There is one who is more powerful who is coming after me. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit." With the best will in the world our own lack of willpower can prevent us from realising our good intentions. This is where the Holy Spirit can help us. We need to ask the Holy Spirit to give us the vision and the will to produce the proof of the pudding.

Pope Leo's Prayer intention for December - For Christians in areas of conflict. Let us pray that Christians living in areas of war or conflict, especially in the Middle East, might be seeds of peace, reconciliation, and hope.

More Advent Reading - The Essence of Prayer by Sr. Ruth Burrows. When we find ourselves to be more Martha than Mary, Sr. Ruth encourages us to sit at the feet of Jesus in prayer, which "is not primarily something we are doing to God, something we are giving to God but what God is doing for us. And what God is doing for us is giving us the divine Self in love."


First Saturday Devotions 6th December - will begin with The Holy Rosary at 9:30am in St. John Vianney.
